Sunday School or Small Groups?



Baptists have a Bible teaching program we call Sunday School which has been around for well more than a century. I read a comment Baptist scholar, E.Y. Mullins, made about Sunday School in 1902. Therefore, I know Baptist churches had some form of Sunday School as early as 1902.

It's obvious why we call this structure for Bible teaching Sunday School — we meet on Sunday mornings. That usually occurs in the hour prior to morning worship. At Falls, Sunday School begins at 10:00 and worship at 11:00. Some of us arrive around 9:30 and drink coffee, have a snack and talk. We talk about the weather, politics, sports, what's happening at Falls, what we hope will happen at Falls and what we hope never happens again at Falls! Afterwards, we go to

Church Improvement Projects

The Building and Grounds Committee is considering three projects which would improve our physical facility and grounds. The committee would present these projects to the church at a called conference once the proposals are agreed on and finalized.

Project I

- A. Refinish the hardwood floors in the sanctuary and vestibule.
- B. Clean and refurbish our pews after the flooring project is completed.
- C. Replace the pew cushions if a suitable and matching fabric can be found.

Project II

- A. Remodel the upstairs restrooms to include replacing toilets and creating a lounge area and new vanity for women.
- B. Upgrade water supply to downstairs restrooms and install new a toilet in the women's restroom.

Project III

- A. Remove and replace pavement in the parking lots to include curbs for water runoff and add additional gravel to other areas as needed.

The Finance Committee was made aware of the projects under consideration and they believe we have

our Sunday School classes at 10:00.

What's the purpose of Sunday School? In the beginning Baptists viewed Sunday School as a tool of evangelism. Most of the people Baptized in Baptist churches for many years came to the baptismal pool through a Sunday School class. In fact, when I was a child, my preacher-dad used to talk about Sunday School as the "evangelistic arm of the church." A simple strategy for church growth was to get people to Sunday School and then you could reach them for church membership. It worked well for decades.

Sunday School also provided a means for assimilation of new members. Engagement with a Sunday School Class on a weekly basis helped new members quickly feel like they "belonged" to the church. That's very important. We've learned many people who leave a church never really felt like they were part of it. They were unable to break into a group which gave them support and encouragement.

This is 2019 and Sunday School has changed. Perhaps its finest mission today is it provides small groups where people can come together, study the Bible, share about their lives' stories and pray. We all need to belong to a small group. Groups help us grow; they nurture us; they gently prod us to give up on our negativity; they help us move forward from our troubles of

the past; to see ourselves more objectively; they help lift us up when we fall; they are there to support us in our hours of great need. In my many years of ministry I have often seen small groups lift church members up in times of great need, such as at the death of a family member.

You need to belong to a small group and we have small groups at Falls that are open for new members. We call it Sunday School. Come join us and if you come at 9:30 you can have a cup of coffee and maybe a donut or an apple fritter.
