Commit to reading the bible verse of the day as listed in this insert each morning (will also be posted on our Facebook page daily).



lecting volunteer workers for 2019-2020. That includes our committees and other volunteer positions in the church, such as our Sunday School workers. We will have a called business meeting to elect the committee's recommendations in August. We will also elect the deacons you nominated at that meeting.

I want to plan a committee orientation and planning meeting soon after the new slate of workers is adopted. My idea is for us to meet on a Wednesday night after supper with each committee discussing projects for the new church year. I will ask the committee chairs to give that information to the commission chairs and they will bring it to the Church Council where we will use the information from the committees to plan activities for 2019-2020. We are a "people" driven church. Each member has a voice and the most effective way for us to express our voices is through our committees.

In addition, we have a lot of excitement in the building on Sunday mornings as people gather for Sunday School; that's right, we still have Sunday School, and we have a place for you. I join with the group in the "coffee shop" for treats and, obviously, coffee and take part in the "wide-ranging" conversation. No topic is off limits. Occasionally somebody has

a good joke, and this is just occasionally, and we catch up on current events in each other's lives. It's amazing what can be learned by sitting quietly and listening. For me, those moments frame my mental attitude for the rest of the morning. Then we move to our Sunday School classes. Let me remind you about the Raleigh Baptist Association's Extravaganza training event. This year's event will be August 17 beginning at 9:15 and will be held at Forest Hills Baptist Church at 201 Dixie Trail, Raleigh. Multiple training labs are offered at two sessions, 9:15-10:30 and 10:45-noon. Timely conferences will be offered, such as keeping our children safe in a predatory society. In addition, conferences will be held on how to use modern technology to advance the Gospel through local churches. Some of our people attended a session on the use of technology for reaching people at a previous conference and came back and designed a new web site for our church.
