## Tithes?

With budget season rapidly approaching, I have thought a lot lately about tithing, why we do it, when, how much. ...? My list of questions keeps going on, but the results of benevolence are obvious. In the role as your Treasurer, you have often heard me say, "Thank you for your generous giving! It helps to pay the bills of the Church when there is money in the bank!"


Recently I was given a publication, *Church Financial Guidebook* published by North Carolina Baptists. This document says, "The correct Biblical concept of money is that God allows us to manage it for him." (page 1) Every Tuesday the first task I complete is reconciling the Teller's count sheet to what is entered into the financial software by the Financial Secretary. This is an important responsibility for me as a steward of the money given to the church. I and all the Church leadership take the stewardship of God's money seriously.

Just like our homes and businesses, the Church requires funds to operate. My next thought is even when I say the money we collect is God's money, are we just saying that out of some reverence or devotion? The Church Financial Guideline states, "... training for the treasurer to help lead the church and church members to see all money is God's money. Many people think it is their money, and they give a portion of it to God. The correct Biblical concept of money is that God owns it all and allows us to manage it for him."

Is that accurate? Let's see.

What is a tithe? We all have heard the term. We have all perhaps used the word.





A tithe is a specific amount (10 percent of your income) that you give first, and an offering is anything extra you give beyond that.

In the Old Testament, the Israelites were commanded by God to give a tenth of their produce and livestock to support the Levites, who had no inheritance in the land. Tithing was seen as a way to worship and serve God with one's resources.

New International Version (NIV), Malachi 3:10-12:

"Bring the whole tithe (translated as 10 percent, Christian Standard Bible, CSB) into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it. 11 I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not drop their fruit before it is ripe," says the Lord Almighty. 12 "Then all the nations will call you blessed, for yours will be a delightful land," says the Lord Almighty.

And, Leviticus 27:30 (NIV) says, "A tithe of everything from the land, whether grain from the soil or fruit from the trees, belongs to the Lord; it is holy to the Lord."

See a pattern here?

God gives us gifts and a tithe is a sign of our appreciation for those gifts?

However, I can't help but think Tithing isn't for God's benefit. Were these men trying to speak of the Church when they say "Lord Almighty"? I think so. God doesn't need our money. Instead, maybe tithing is meant for our benefit because sacrificing a portion of our income reminds us to rely on God to meet our needs and also reminds us to praise him for the gifts he gives us daily. Plus, it makes us more aware of the needs of others too.

In fact, supporting the needs of our Pastor and the work of our church is one of the main purposes of tithing. Tithing helps our church actively be the missionoriented church we all know by helping others.
