Result of Thanksgiving

Acts 28:15

Paul, a prisoner, is on his journey toward Rome. It has been a difficult journey. He has been shipwrecked (27:41-44). He has been bitten by a poisonous snake (28:3) and accused one minute of being a murderer and the next minute of being a god. He has experienced no Christian fellowship for at least

three months (28:11-14).

On his approach to Rome, some of the brethren came out to greet and encourage him.

“Whom when Paul saw, thanked God, and took courage.”

From this story, we notice three things pertaining to Thanksgiving.

instant he or she opens the box. Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift. You can also include a personal note and photo. Fill out the box label and include \$9 to cover the costs of shipping.

What NOT to include: candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

Samaritan's Purse has been collecting shoeboxes for the more than 25 years and delivering them to children in need around the world. Each box is an opportunity for a boy or girl to experience the love of God in a tangible way and hear the Gospel!






2019 Poinsettia Orders

Thanks continued ...

“When Paul saw” – the word “saw” here means to perceive to consider, to understand.

How often do we not express thanks simply because we do not perceive what God has done in our life. We need to be more perceptive about the blessing of God in our life.

II. THE CHOICE IN THANKSGIVING

Instead of complaining about his stresses, pressures and persecutions, Paul chose to give thanks. Instead of bemoaning his imprisonment, he thanks God for friends who come to support him.

Thanksgiving is a choice we make. Thanksgiving is independent of circumstances but not independent of choice. We choose to be thankful or not.

III. THE COURAGE FROM THANKSGIVING

Being thankful renewed Paul’s strength and helped him to be courageous as he faced his imprisonment in Rome.

Gratitude produces fortitude! There is something invigorating about thanks-giving that instills within us a confidence to face the trials of life.

As a person looks at God’s blessings with thanks-giving, it renews strength and instills courage to face tomorrow. Thanksgiving today gives me strength for tomorrow.

Try Thanksgiving ... and you will then find your nerves braced, and your loins girded to meet whatever lies ahead.

Carolina Baptist Aging Ministry, NCBAM as it is called, I am doubly thankful for the work of the BCH. The new ministry of working with senior adults across our state fills a void which had existed in our Baptist work. The aging population is growing, as we say, by “leaps and bounds” and it is essential that we Baptists reach out to the needs of aging adults in the name of Jesus Christ. The multi-generational work of the BCH is captured in a quote from this year’s bulletin insert: “The heart of the Baptist Children’s Homes (BCH) beats with a rhythm of hope that extends to children, families and adults. For every person’s specific need, there is a unique BCH ministry ready to offer hope and the opportunity for a bright future.”

The theme for this year’s BCH’s offering is “Hope and Future” taken from Jeremiah 29:11, “For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.” I read about the BCH’s rescuing two young brothers, Jacob and Jonah, ages 12 and 9 who were living in a tent with their mother in the woods. The mom was an addict and could not take care of her sons. Everything changed for the boys when they were rescued by BCH. From a cold and damp tent, they were taken to the warmth of a BCH cottage where their needs were met. Through our offerings to BCH, Falls was part of that rescue. “Hope and Future” came to Jacob and Jonah through the BCH.
