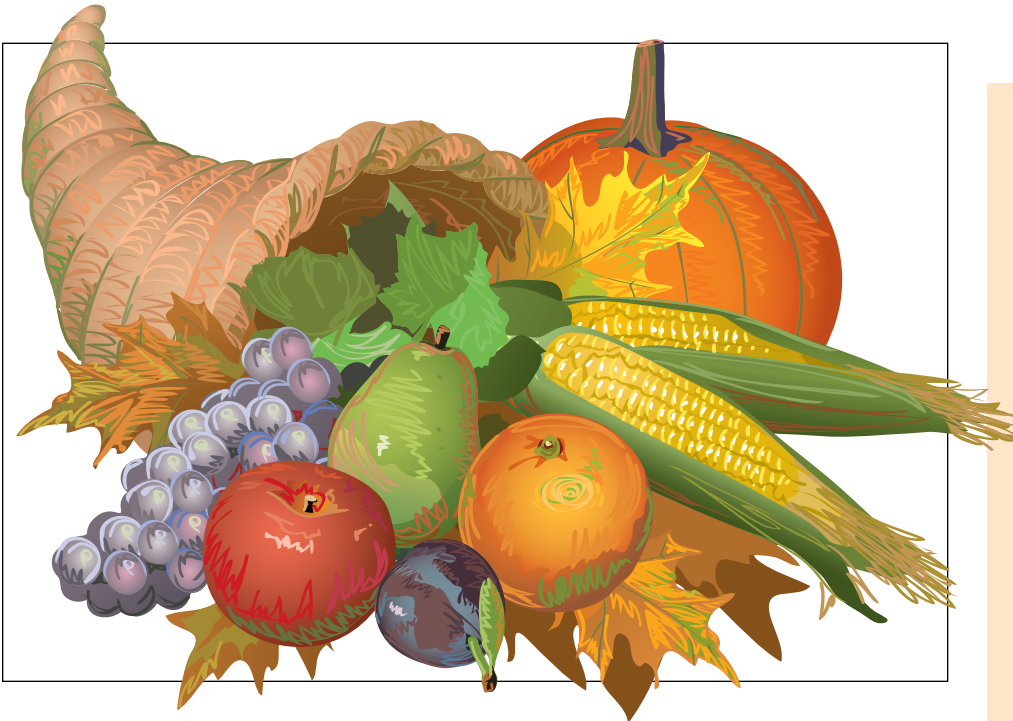

He has been with the children's homes for many years and will "warm our hearts" with stories about the work of the children's homes. Keith will speak at our worship service on November 21.

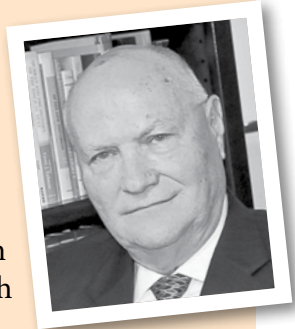

A Month of Prayer

Last Wednesday night we completed our study of I Samuel. Though the book was named for the Prophet/Priest Samuel, it is about David, the shepherd boy that became the greatest King of Israel. The book begins with Hannah pleading with God to give her a child.



Though she is deeply loved by her husband, Elkanah, she feels that life is not complete without a child. She promised to give the child back to God for his service. Hannah prayed so fervently that the priest, Eli, observing her praying at the place of worship in Shiloh thought that she was drunk. Eli asked, "How long will you go on drunk?" Hannah answered, "No my Lord, a bleak-spirited woman am I. Neither wine nor hard drink have I drunk, but I poured out my heart to the

Lord.” Her prayer was answered, and Samuel was born, and, in the by-and-by, Samuel anointed young David King of Israel and the focus of Israel’s history ever since has been on this shepherd boy who, according to the Apostle Paul, was after God’s own heart (Acts 13:22). The history of Israel’s greatest king begins with a simple woman saying, “I poured out my heart to the Lord.” That’s true prayer: pouring out one’s heart to the Lord.

That’s what I want us to do in November: pour out our hearts to the Lord in prayer. Your future may depend upon your prayers; our church may depend upon your prayers; our nation may depend upon your prayers. I’ve never lived in a time where prayer was more needed by God’s people than it is now. Our nation is divided; churches are rapidly declining; families are fragmenting over trivial matters; and preachers sound like politicians and politicians sound like preachers, up is down and down is up. We need to pray.

I want you to prioritize prayer during the month of November by spending time each week praying for

specific topics. All the topics focus on Jesus Christ. There is no praying without focusing on Christ. He taught us to pray, “Our Father who art in heaven” and he prayed for his followers to act as one. The Gospels depict scenes of Christ praying to the Father. He prayed for his disciples; he prayed for sinners, the despised and rejected among him; he prayed in agony the night before his death on the cross. He taught us to pray in his name. We must pray about Christ, and his work and our place in his work.

These are the weekly themes of prayer beginning the first week in November and ending the week of thanksgiving:

October 31-November 6: “Christ’s Grace and Mercy”

November 7-13: “Christ’s Abiding Presence”

November 14-20: “Christ’s Church”

November 21-27: “Christ’s Blessings”

Offer thanksgiving for each of these, Christ’s Grace and Mercy, His Abiding Presence (the Holy Spirit), His Church (Falls Baptist Church), and His Blessings. Each of these subjects takes the focus off you and your problems, aches and pains and miseries, and focuses on what Christ has done for us. He died for us offering us grace and mercy. He promised to be with us through his Holy Spirit. His church is built on him, and his blessings are immeasurable. Amen.
