For many ministers, modern technology has allowed us to work more efficiently and bring more order to our work. I have in the garage at our home the Smith Corona typewriter that my mother used to type my father's sermons. He made the final preparations for the sermon he would preach on Sunday on Saturday morning and mother typed it Saturday afternoon. The Smith Corona has been replaced by the computer which has shortened the time it takes to move a sermon from an idea inspired by in-depth reading of the scripture and prayer to a finished product, that is, if you use the technology as meant to be used. I had a good friend who was a pastor and had good computer sills, but he wrote his sermons by hand using a Bic pen and a legal pad and then sat before the computer and entered the hand-written manuscript. I thought of that as an unnecessary step

Modern technology, however, cannot replace the personal, hands-on basic mission of the church to reach people for Christ. Technology may assist us in the initial stages of identifying groups of unchurched people and provide information that may help us reach them for Christ. But it will not replace the personal side of one-on-one ministry. I stopped by Starbucks last Saturday and ordered my seasonal favorite: a Pumpkin Spice latte. Business was slow and allowed

time for me to have a conversation with the Barista. A door opened before me and I asked, "Are you a Christian?" Smiling he said, "Yes", and told me about his church. Nothing can replace one-on-one evangelism.

This brings me to the holiday season approaching us. We are a few weeks away from Thanksgiving and then there is Christmas, for me, the most exciting time of the year. There is the meaning the exchanging of gifts brings to Christmas, we all like receiving gifts, but more importantly Christmas brings us to remember the journey of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem where Jesus was born, and the magnificent choir of angels and humble shepherds who appeared at the Advent.

So here is my Christmas challenge: let's make our list of names of people we can invite to Christmas celebrations at Falls (and there will be several), friends, family members, the waitress that serves us lunch, the Barista who mixes our coffee, the haggard stranger begging for a handout at the traffic signal (you might have to bring him) old friends that we assume are active in a church somewhere, the errant adult child, and the list goes on. A simple gesture, inviting someone to church, may bring him and, who knows, that may lead to another miracle at Christmas — one more person turning to the real miracle of Christmas, the Son of God born of Mary, wrapped in swaddling clothes, and placed in a manger.
