voice is no longer heard; tender exchanges of affection are missed. Our minds are flooded with scenes from the past when all the family was together, and thoughts of death and separation did not cast shadows over the celebration of the season.

There is, however, a constant for us that nothing can mute: Christmas calls us to celebrate the birth of the King, our Lord Jesus Christ. During the season of Christmas, we remember the angels told the shepherds to go to Bethlehem and see the newborn babe and we remember the star which was shining in the dark oriental sky to direct the wisemen to the Christ child. As with the shepherds and wisemen, we, too, will celebrate the birth of the King.

I am writing these words the day before the election on November 5. We shall have to wait until the counting and recounting are completed and challenges resolved to celebrate. I am not thinking about the celebration one may have because his/her candidate won but celebrating because we have come through it and all the ads, signs, debates, all of it, are behind us and, by the time you read these words, it will be time to move on, whether your candidates won or not. Let's resign ourselves to that — to move on and search for a sense of "normalcy," a word coined by President Hard-

ing (presidents can do that). Let's determine we will put down the divisions of the campaign season and embrace the meaning of "one nation under God." We remain the greatest experiment in the history of democracy. I know we are flawed as a nation because we are all sinners. We are not perfect. We all get it wrong sometime regardless of political persuasions. The hope we have for meaning in our lives is not bound up in political processes or the people we elect. As Christians, we have found the meaning: it is not in political associations; it is in a person, Jesus Christ.

Join me in the early stages of preparing for Thanksgiving and Christmas. "Come You Thankful People Come" we will sing with gusto. And "Silent Night, Holy Night" will be sung to the swell of the organ because it was a silent night and a holy night when long ago God entered his creation as a little baby, placed by Mary in

a manger in Bethlehem. Let me be the first to wish you a Happy Thanksgiving and a Merry Christmas.
